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Sapphire Class

This term in Sapphire class we have been learning all about Space using the story books *Man on the Moon, Whatever Next* and *Aliens Love Underpants!* We talked about some of the different planets, including Saturn with its rings and Jupiter with its giant red spot. Having watched videos of rockets taking off, we learnt about astronauts and how they live on the space station where there is very little gravity, which means they can float around! In one lesson, we watched the video of the Apollo 11 moon landing that happened 53 years ago in 1969! We also loved playing in our Space Station!

On the run up to Christmas we read the story 'A Christmas Carol' about Scrooge and talked about how people lived when Queen Victoria was on the throne; heating their homes with coal fires, using candles for lighting and writing with quills something we got to try ourselves in class! It was fascinating to learn how people lived differently in the past.

In Maths, we have been learning all about numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. We have been practising counting items, sorting and matching objects and learning about 2d shapes.

Finally, one of our highlights was a trip to Orpington Library. We walked all the way there and listened carefully as the librarian read us some stories and talked about the library. We got to look around at the books and even got the bus back to school!





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Topaz Class

This has been a busy half term in Topaz class; the children have been working hard learning cursive handwriting, writing sentences with the correct structure and editing them. In Maths they have been working out number facts within 20, comparing numbers, counting on from ten and then counting the ones. We also looked at 2D and 3D shapes and the children were creating patterns with them. In Science we have been learning about animals including humans, the different structures, habitats and diets. In Art the children have been learning about primary colours and how to make secondary colours by mixing them, we have also been tinting and shading using a primary colour. In History we learned about the Ice Age and the adaptations that happened over time. In RE we have been looking at the Christmas story as well as

practising for our Nativity play, we hope you enjoyed it!

We have also been enjoying our own forest school this term, the children thoroughly enjoy learning and exploring outside and having a well-deserved drink and biscuit.

We have learnt about the Vikings in History, the digestive system in science and we also did our end of unit performance following our learning of djembe drumming with Mrs Rabin from The Bromley Youth Music Trust. A highlight of this term has been the teamed up performance for the Christmas presentation with Year 3. The children put on an amazing performance for parents at the Temple church.







Emerald Class

Emerald class have been very busy this half term! We have all had so much fun in our swimming and forest school lessons and very much look forward to these continuing into the Spring term. In science this half term, we have explored all 5 types of scientific enquiry; one of our favourite was conducting a comparative and fair test into which material would be the best at preventing chocolate from melting! Our English lessons have been based on the book, *The Boy at the Back of the Classroom*, about a Syrian refugee child adjusting to their new life in England. We have been touched to learn about the difficult experiences had by many refugee children and were inspired to write and deliver a persuasive speech, urging our audience to treat refugees with kindness and fairness. In the run up to Christmas, Emerald class have revisited the Christmas story in their RE lessons and participated in a passionate debate discussing whether the Christmas story is "true", and what "truth," means. Children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Sir Francis Drake and the Spanish Armada in their history lessons and put their drama skills to the test in the form of a historical talk show! We have ended the year spreading Christmas joy within our local community, singing beautifully at the Nugent centre and our local church. Thank you Emerald for all of your hard work this Autumn term! From all in Year 6, we wish you a wonderful Christmas break and a very happy new year.






Reminders
