Dear parents and carers,

We are very excited to introduce a new member of staff to the team at St Mary Cray Primary School - **Colin, our certified therapy dog!** Colin is a 2-year-old Golden Retriever.

School dogs have been proven to help develop Pupils' reading skills, improve behaviour, attendance and academic confidence, as well as increasing student understanding of responsibility and in the development of empathy and nurturing skills. We hope that a school dog will be a beneficial addition to the pastoral support we offer here at St Mary Cray Primary School.

As part of the process of becoming a certified therapy dog, Colin visits the vet regularly for general health check-ups and for regular and required vaccinations. As part of the process of

introducing a therapy dog in school we have risk assessments in place and relevant insurance.

Please note that our certified therapy dog is the only dog allowed on the school site. We politely ask that you ensure that you do not enter the site at any time with a dog.

We have had another lovely half term of learning in Sapphire class. Our focus has been on lifecycles, including frogs, ladybirds, caterpillars, spiders and humans! In English there has been a big focus on handwriting and writing sentences with conjunctions. In maths the children have been using a range of manipulatives to solve problems with numbers to 50. In PSHE and DT the children have been learning about being healthy and staying safe whilst preparing food. The children had fun learning how to peel and grate carrots in preparation for making a carrot and sultana salad.

All the children had a taste and most of them liked it! In science we have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees, their functions and what happens to deciduous trees without their leaves. The children have continued to enjoy going to Forest school and having the freedom to explore.

# **Onyx Class**

Year 2 have been learning about a range of interesting topics this half term, in and outside of the classroom! We had the amazing opportunity to use our Forest School every Tuesday again this term and even got to go on a trip to the Hemsley Conservation Centre. In English we have been focusing on poetry and our latest story *The Pirates Next Door*, using our imagination to change features of the story to make it our own. In Maths we have been focusing on different forms of measure and looking at how we compare these. Backtracking to last

term's History topic 'The Great Fire of London', we had the opportunity to burn our houses down in a safe environment. Moving on from History, this term we focused on Geography; looking at settlements and comparing the differences between villages, towns and cities. In Science we explored different plants, researched what each part of the plant does and even got to dissect a bean seed and bulb to see what goes on inside them. We all worked together to make our new sunflower display and even got to plant our own sunflowers to take home. In Religious Education





we focused on the Christian story of Easter and understood why we celebrate it with hotcross buns and Easter eggs. PSHE allowed us to discuss why it is important to be healthy and got us thinking what can we change in our lifestyle to make sure we are being healthy. Finally in DT we got to understand how moving pictures are made

and why they may be used in specific stories, we even got to make our own moving picture book. We had the greatest opportunity in Onyx class to watch over 8 little eggs and see how they grew into healthy fluffy chicks and of course we had many cuddles!

## **Opal and Pearl Class**

This half term we have welcomed Miss Rae to Pearl Class who has settled in wonderfully and has already a great rapport with the children of both classes. We have had so much fun with our learning this half-term from learning cricket with a coach, who taught us the key skills for our PE Immersion Day Match, to our trip to the Natural

History Museum which was so much fun. The Summer Term will be filled with more fun learning activities and we cannot wait to get started. However, in the meantime, please enjoy a well-deserved break.

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#### **Diamond Class**

In English, the children have been reading 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.' This story had a great impact on the children, and it is a book they will remember for a long time. They wrote letters and newspapers, which helped them to develop their writing skills. In Maths, the children have been learning about measurements, particularly perimeter. We then moved on to fractions, where we used the bar model to help find fractions of amounts. Geography has made a return to our learning. We have been learning about erosions and the coast. To demonstrate how erosion affects the coasts, the children created their own islands using corn starch. In Music, we focused on pulse and rhythm. The children were able to develop their understanding of musical concepts while having fun. In Computing, we have been using Edublogs and learning some touch typing. This has helped to develop the children's

computer skills. In PE, the children enjoyed learning about cricket. They were able to learn new skills and develop their teamwork. In RE, we have been learning about the Christian faith, particularly Easter. This has helped the children to understand the

importance of this religious celebration.
Lastly, children are being encouraged to practice their times tables, as Year 4 is the Multiplication tables check year. This will help to develop their maths skills and prepare them for the upcoming test.



#### **Emerald Class**

Emerald class have worked incredibly hard this half term. In maths, children have embraced the challenge of fractions, demonstrating our school values of resilience and collaboration daily in working together to solve complex problems. We have been reading *Stormbreaker* by Anthony Horowitz in English, a spy thriller that has kept us on the edge of our seats! We have been inspired to write a diary entry in character, a non-chronological report explaining the use of different spy gadgets, and a balanced argument about whether or not children should be allowed to work as MI6 spies. In their science lessons, children have been testing the viscosity of various

condiments, investigating which solids will dissolve in water, and exploring methods of purifying flood water. To coincide with Easter, children have explored the events of Holy Week in detail, eventually engaging in a respectful debate discussing whether the events of Holy Week were predestined. Emerald class have also embraced cricket in their PE lessons this half term, demonstrating fabulous teamwork and sportsmanship on a weekly basis. 




#### **Ruby Class**
